Davis Outperforms Goliath

Davis Davis & Harmon LLC (DDH) was tapped to take over an audit from a Big 4 consulting group that had lingered for over five-years.

Client was selected for a routine sales/use tax audit and hired a Big 4 consulting group to manage the audit. Because the audit lingered over five-years in the hands of the Big 4 firm, the auditor closed the audit reflecting a huge tax liability which was later appealed. **DDH was hired during the appeals process to defend the audit.**

Challenge

- The corporation was assessed \$22 million during the audit.
- The auditor was opposed to reducing or removing any dollars from the audit due to the lack of cooperation from the predecessor Big 4 consultants.
- The auditor became frustrated with predecessor Big 4 consultants and was unwilling to allow additional time to resolve audit issues during the appeals process.

Solution

DDH fostered a more collegial and less combative relationship with the auditor to facilitate the defense of the audit.

DDH performed a thorough review of the records for items being assessed in the audit to identify a legal basis to remove transactions from the audit.

DDH successfully reclassed sales and purchase transactions assessed in the audit to nontaxable.

DDH implemented a strategy to include refund reviews within the scope of the audits.



Results

DDH was successful in getting the auditor to agree to allow time to prepare a proper audit defense.

DDH successfully reduced the \$22M audit assessment down to approximately \$2M.

DDH was engaged to manage the next audit for the same state, which resulted in **a net refund of approximately \$11M.**

DDH has reduced audit completion time for this state from five-years to under twoyears.

AUDIT DEFENSE

DDH successfully reduced audit assessment from \$22M down to \$2M.

REFUND RECOVERY

DDH successfully obtained a net \$11M refund in the second audit.

COST SAVINGS

DDH implemented a refund recovery strategy which maximized the clients returns.

Audit turn-around time for this state was reduced from five years to two years providing immediate interest savings.

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
